"I Could Not Believe People Like that Exist!"

Viola couldn't believe her ears. *Could this be for real?*

"Forgive as Christ forgave you. Freely. Over and over again."

"Christ forgave me?" she thought in confusion. Forgiveness had always been something a priest granted. It never occurred to her *she* could forgive.

Viola knew this was the answer to the desperate words she'd uttered almost in spite of herself earlier that week, "God do something! Save my family!"

Viola and her husband, Caro, were dangling above the precipice of divorce, hanging on by a fingernail.

Viola's friend "randomly" brought her to the Baptist Church in Lodz, Poland, which is pastored by ITMI's Leszek Wakula. And just "randomly" Leszek was preaching on love and forgiveness that day.

"I could not believe that people like this exist!" Viola shared, "I was a stranger and I was welcome - like part of a family!"

Two weeks later, Viola submitted her life to Christ.

"It was such a new birth," Leszek remembers, "that we all rejoiced because we could see this change."

But that's not all.

"If Jesus can change my life, he can change Caro's," Viola thought. So she

encouraged him to join her one Sunday.

While chatting with Leszek after the service, Caro told Leszek he like the "personal" and "friendly" atmosphere. "Not like those huge churches where people don't know each other," he said. He also liked the music.

It turned out that Caro was - of all things - a drummer. Something Leszek's wife, Ania, and a friend had been praying would enrich their worship team for awhile!

Three Sundays later, Caro was keeping the rhythm for the worship team with his percussion skills.

Viola and Caro's marriage began to heal.

Leszek and Anna faithfully practice what they call a "lifestyle of discipleship." This means they spend time with people one-on-one, leading them closer to Jesus from whatever point they are at.

"Once I get my hands on someone," Leszek laughs, "I meet with them and disciple them."

The best part?

Leszek met with Caro regularly for six months before Caro gave his life to Christ, but when he did, the



evidence of change was so strong that Viola and Caro's son, Luke, gave his life to Jesus, too!

The discipleship didn't stop at evangelism. Caro was equipped by Leszek beyond salvation. He is now an elder in Leszek's church.

There's even more:

Leszek and Anna have been pastoring the only Baptist Church in Lodz, a city of almost 700,000, for over 10 years.

When he started, Leszek promised the church two things. "I will love you," he told them, "and I will preach the Word of God as faithfully as I can. I will start on my knees."

As home to hundreds of textile factories, Lodz boasted the largest textile industry in Eastern Europe until about 1989, when the economy drastically changed. Hundreds lost

their jobs as factory after factory shut down.

In other areas, where industry failed on such a large scale, the government has stepped in to aid in recovery, but Lodz was overlooked. The city has one of the highest unemployment rates in Poland.

Today, almost 30 years later, there are many who live in "generational poverty" meaning there is no one in a family who understands or believes in a life that doesn't depend on welfare. Many have stopped trying. Their life's plan is to live on welfare and they envision their kids doing the same.

In fact, statistically speaking, there is a 90% chance that those who were born in certain parts of the city will remain below the poverty line.

These circumstances make the city fertile ground for

Christians to demonstrate the love of Jesus. Any service they do is so needed that it is extremely wellreceived.

Leszek's church operates a ministry to the disabled, elderly and alone.

These are impoverished people who have no family, or whose family simply abandoned them because caring for them is too inconvenient or hard.

Their ministry often gets the "worst"

cases. The ones no one wants. Where the stench is oppressive.

Where you'll likely leave covered with urine that isn't your own. The cases that prompt people to ask, "Why would you do this?"

"But it is joy for us," Leszek says. "Because we get to share our love with them."

The elderly and disabled ministry serves 200-400 people, with 100-200 volunteers and is well-recognized by city officials. "Go to the Baptists; they are the best," they say.

Why does this matter?

Many of the volunteers began before having a relationship with Jesus, but came to faith when they saw the demonstration of God's love from Leszek's

of God's love from Leszek's church!

Leszek's church is also renovating a four-story building to become a school, to share their love with kids and families. The building was unbelievably decrepit when they reclaimed it 6 years ago. It had been confiscated by the Communists after World War II.

There is still quite a bit of work to be done, but the parts that are complete continued on p.4

From the Director

"One million down, 59 million to go."

Our Polish partner, <u>Piotr Zaremba</u>, has been here in the U. S. for most of February. He didn't get to come to the States last year - a first in a very long time. Piotr doesn't come to get away from his work in Poland, because he brings as much of his work with him as he can fit in between as many "thank you" visits as is possible. Piotr loves to show the printed, footnoted, cross-referenced, newest printed Polish Bible, the one that all of us had a small part in helping him translate and publish.

His kind and gentle report always includes some insight into what we have helped him do for his beloved but lost and blind Poland. "We have over 1 million copies of our translation now distributed to Polish speaking people." He then immediately says, "...we have only 59 million to go." Piotr has a passion to reach all the approximately 60 million Polish speaking people in the world. The first step was to get them an accurate, readable and usable form of God's Word.



As happy as he is with the success and acceptance of his new translation, Piotr says, "...but I am greedy. I want more." Anyone that knows Piotr knows how unlike him it is for the word "greedy" to come out of his gentle, soft-spoken mouth.

"More" to Piotr is the next big opportunity he sees to reach his country for Christ. You see, Poland has been decimated not just by communism, but a dominant and militant state religion. This one-two punch has almost completely inoculated the Poles to their need for Christ. Piotr believes, and often states, that one way to reach Poland is to reach "the largest unreached people group - the children." With lost parents, these children are not even hearing of the love, hope and purpose of Jesus. Piotr wants to introduce Christian education to Poland's elementary school children. Strangely, the Polish government will help a school if it meets certain standards and has Polish students enrolled.

Piotr believes that if God will allow - and use us to help Poland - the school can be self-sufficient in about three years' time.

Imagine our disappointment as our own <u>Darek Baniski</u>, husband and father of three children, two of which have been diagnosed with the very rare and currently incurable, Niemann-Pick disease, was in essence fired from his very successful position of "President" (or Superintendent) of a highly ranked secondary Polish trade school. He was persecuted for the stance he took on *sola gracia* by being part of the evangelical church. Yet, with Darek not having his usual education employment, he is now able, willing and elated to see how God can use him and his vast education experience to Biblically train the next generation of Poland's children.

Darek, Piotr, and the education team that has been assembled believes that their needs for the first three years are as follows: \$65,000 (USD) first year, \$45,000 second year, \$25,000 third year. ITMI, through one of our dear supporters, has received a commitment to match any donations for this Polish children's education project up to \$20,000 USD. This donor shared that he and his father were concerned that initial costs to start Christian children's education in Poland was going to cost as much as 10x what Piotr and his team have estimated. This donor, who started an Arizona based Christian K-12th grade school and who supported it for decades, knows the exceptional value of what Piotr and Darek are trusting God to do in Poland.

If you are interested in a wonderful and exceptional eternal investment project, will you prayerfully consider <u>helping the children of Poland hear and know the love of Christ</u>, in an environment of care and safety with godly teachers who love and purpose their gifting to nurture these future citizens of God's Kingdom.

William Cary, a missionary to India once said, "...I'll go into the places where you will never go, but you must hold the ropes...." ITMI wants to help Piotr and Darek by holding the ropes as they go where we will never go. Join us if God so leads.


